What happens when 8-year-old girls drop out of school? Doors close, dreams die, and they are at risk for early child marriage, trafficking, and abuse.

Thankfully, Sachi's mom disagreed with the rest of the family and went to work, fighting to save the futures of her children. She heard about our school, just 2 miles from their home. It seemed like a miracle. Sachi and her two brothers could attend this top-notch school for little to no

cost. Not only would her children get an education, but the family would also have access to healthcare and an entire community of mentors rooting for them.
