**You showed up** in 2020 when you gave 652 girls at the highest risk for human trafficking scholarships to school, and you showed up again in 2021 by ensuring 1,203 children orphaned by COVID are safe and sound for the next year.

I invite you to join us in 2022 to free more children, empower more women, and lift up more families. I am hopeful for a brighter year, yet I am aware that we still live in a state of flux. As the year unfolds, I hope you'll remember who DFN is and why we exist: to right injustice, to seek dignity and freedom for every person in every village. In short: we show up.

I'm thankful for you, for your determination to freely share your resources, to generously share your compassion with those who need it most.
